From the Pastor:

This week I visited Koorong Christian Bookshop at West Ryde to purchase a Bible for my Barber. He wants to read the Bible and doesn't know where to get one. We give away Bibles at church to those who don't have one, but I wanted this Bible to come from me, so I went shopping. I have to admit it was overwhelming. I could feel a headache coming on as I looked through the myriads of Bibles that were available. Shelf after shelf of Bibles. Different translations, different shapes and colours, different binding types, some with study notes, some with wide margins, some with atlases and concordances and devotional inserts.

Aren't we blessed? Today, while we open English Bibles in many translations, on our phones, in church, on our bedside table, or audio-Bibles, there are 52 countries in the world where possessing a Bible is illegal. Many believers face harassment, abuse, imprisonment, torture, or even death, simply for having a Bible in their possession. In North Korea the Bible is illegal and you and your family can be killed if you are caught with one. In Afghanistan, or Somalia, just possessing a copy of the Bible could be a death sentence. In other countries believers must share one Bible between a whole church community, travel great distances to find a copy, or sit huddled in underground meetings, whispering passages of the Bible in the secret of their homes.

The Bible is a light in the darkness and hope for generations. It challenges the authority of kings and upends the empires of the world. It brings hope to the hopeless and good news to the poor. But we should not be surprised that as believers we will also experience trouble. Jesus said believers would suffer just as he suffered. When Paul was converted on the road to Damascus the Holy Spirit spoke of him to Annanias saying, "I will show him how much he must suffer for my name." (Acts 9:16)." Faith in Christ brings great blessings but often great suffering, too. Paul would suffer for his faith (see 2 Corinthians 11:23–27). God calls us to commitment, not to comfort. He promises to be with us through suffering and hardship, not to spare us from them.

A Letter from Andrew and Oksana Ford:

Let me start out with a very Big Thank You for keeping us in your prayers and for your messages and support!

So, when I stepped into the role of YWAM Ukraine leader it was a shared position but since my co leader was no longer permanently in Ukraine due to the war he stepped down (a few months ago) and I am now doing the role on my own. This has taken some getting used to, as I have always liked working in a team and as long as I have been a missionary I have always worked together with others.

The name we give to this role in YWAM is "Convenor", it's the idea of bringing together our location or major ministry leaders to keep and build unity within YWAM Ukraine, to pastor and support our leaders, and encourage new vision and growth while staying within the foundational values of YWAM.

To fulfil this role, I need to keep connected to our leaders and their teams, it means running regularly meetings to bring our leaders together, it means organising an annual conference (end of October), it means messages and calls and visits, it means listening and praying, it means preaching or sharing:) it also means keeping and building connections to our international YWAM family.

I am honoured to do this and have plenty of times felt inadequate, but I am grateful that God is growing me in this role, and I am thankful for the support I get in return from the other YWAM leaders I am serving.

But here is the thing, both Oksana and I love to do ministry where we are reaching out to people that don't know Christ and serving those that are in need. And so doing a purely internal YWAM ministry even though it is very important leaves us not totally satisfied so we continue to do other types of outreach ministry. For example, as you already know Oksana has been doing some hospital visits with the Azov battalion, this is only when that battalion have wounded soldiers that are sent to hospitals in Lviv. So, it is just from time to time that Oksana's help is required.

So, a few other of these ministry opportunities we have been a part of recently.

It has been a lot of fun for me to be a teacher for an intermediate group of students at an English club outreach that our local Church runs. It is mostly university aged young people that it is focused on and more than half of those that attending are non-Church goers. There have been several of our students start coming along to Church and are their journey of getting to know Jesus.
