From the Pastor:

On Sunday mornings I have been preaching a series of messages titled, "The challenge of a changed man," and I have been sharing some of the things we saw and learnt on our recent "In the Footsteps Of Paul Tour, in Rome, Turkey and Greece. Paul had been changed by Jesus Christ in a remarkable way. He was so excited about his faith, everything he did, he did that others might come to know Christ. He travelled throughout the Roman Empire sharing the gospel wherever he went.

In Acts 17 we read, on coming to Athens he impressed the people there and he was invited to speak to the people on the Areopagus. Paul's address is a good example of how we can communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ. Paul began by complimenting his audience on their commitment to the god's. He mentions an idol that the Athenians had built to the unknown god. They built this idol for fear of leaving out one of the gods and missing blessings or receiving punishment. So, Paul begins, using this idol to introduce them to the one true God. Paul was not endorsing this god but using the inscription as a common starting point for his witness to the one true God.

Next Paul established common ground by emphasising what they agreed on about God (17:24–29). Paul's message unveiled the Supreme Creator, God, and dwarfed the petty idols that saturated Athens. Finally, he moved his message to the person of Christ, centring on the Resurrection (17:30, 31). Some mocked Paul's message, but some believed.

Let that be an encouragement to us, as we receive the same reactions as we witness. Don't be afraid to witness to others. It's their decision whether they believe or not, but you just be faithful in loving them and letting them know the gospel. You can follow Paul's approach: allow others to get to know you and trust you so they will listen to you. Establish common ground and use examples they understand. Explain the gospel clearly and succinctly moving people toward a decision about Jesus Christ.

The church secretary is a Church Deacon (church leader) who keeps minutes of meetings, looks after correspondence and liaises with our office manager to correctly file and keep meeting records.

• A Property Officer.

Geoff Toon is retiring from this role. The property officer can be a Deacon or can be represented by one of the Deacons. We have many people who can help with the day-to-day maintenance of our church property but the property officer manages them and makes sure our buildings and property are maintained.

• A Deacon with no portfolio.

It would be wonderful to have another Deacon who can help us practically lead the church and help the Pastor, Elders and other Deacons make important decisions for the day to day smooth running of the church.

• A Nominations Committee member.

After serving in this role for 6 years Sheila Hooper needs to have a year off from the Nominations Committee. The nominations committee calls for nominations and identifies volunteers to fill various roles in the church, which are affirmed by the church meeting.

Also, at the annual meeting we need to update some of the church's child safe policies.
