From the Pastor:

None of us like the subject of Death. It is a subject that most Australians will avoid at all costs. Yet it is also a subject that every person must consider. We will all experience death. While the world fears what may come, what should a Christian's response be to death? The Apostle Paul answers that question, in Philippians 1:21... For to me, living means living for Christ, and dying is even better." (NLT).

The death of God's people, even when it is caused by wicked people with evil intent, is always under the divine sovereignty of God. To those who don't believe in God, life on earth is all that's guaranteed, and so it's natural for them to strive for this world's values: money, popularity, power, pleasure, and prestige. For Paul, however, to live meant to develop eternal values and to die was even better than living, because in death he would no longer suffer from the troubles of this world, but rather he would be with Christ face to face, of which said Paul, "there is nothing better. To die in Christ is to gain everything!"

Annual Church Meeting - Sunday 25th August, 11am to 1pm:

We believe that every true member of God's church is a Priest. Four times we meet to make decisions about the business of the church here at Ettalong. One of these meetings, every August, is our annual meeting when we affirm people to lead our church.

This year we need to affirm:

• A Church Secretary.

The church secretary is a Church Deacon (church leader) who keeps minutes of meetings, looks after correspondence and liaises with our office manager to correctly file and keep meeting records.

• A Property Officer.

Geoff Toon is retiring from this role. The property officer can be a Deacon or can be represented by one of the Deacons. We have many people who can help with the day-to-day maintenance of our church property, but the property officer manages them and makes sure our buildings and property are maintained.

• A Deacon with no portfolio.

It would be wonderful to have another Deacon who can help us practically lead the church and help the Pastor, Elders and other Deacons make important decisions for the day-to-day smooth running of the church.

• A Nominations Committee member.

After serving in this role for 6 years Sheila Hooper needs to have a year off from the Nominations Committee. The nominations committee calls for nominations and identifies volunteers to fill various roles in the church, which are affirmed by the church meeting.
