Joys Testimony Given on Sunday 9th September:

Good morning church,

I just want to take this opportunity to thank you all for your prayers and share with you how Robert and myself have been blessed by your prayers and by our Heavenly Father over these past four months.

We were on an amazing trip "Walking in the footsteps of Paul" when on the 9th of May at the end of our sightseeing at Laodicea, I managed to trip and fall heavily on my way back to the bus. I came down on the paved area outside of the café and am still unaware of how the top of my right arm became so broken when both my hands and knees carried grazes, and my nose was bruised from my glasses before they flew off my face. There was plenty of help to pick me up and sit me on a chair and the nurses on the team were able to assess me, while **others quickly prayed over my right shoulder for God's healing and help in the situation. From this time on, my pain was minimal**, but my arm felt heavy and like jelly. I remember saying to nurse Sheila I think I have broken the head off the humerus and the nurse in me said I'll be Ok as we know it just has to hang in a collar and cuff sling until it heals.

We were 45minutes from our lunch stop and our guide needed to keep us moving so a sling was found from the first aid kit, my arm immobilised, and Robert assisted me back onto the bus into my comfortable seat and off we went. After some time, I did say to Heather that for everyone's peace of mind I should have an Xray at some stage to know exactly what my injury really was. Our guide contacted the place where we were to lunch and found out that the town had an emergency medical centre. Once we reached the town the bus dropped the tour guide, Robert and me off at the emergency centre and proceeded to take the rest of the team to lunch. At the centre I was ushered in immediately. Thank you, God, for our tour guide because no one spoke English. I was quickly xrayed, and I was struck dumb when the tour guide informed me that I had a very badly smashed top of my right arm and that I need urgent surgery to repair it and remove all of the debris bone in my shoulder. Please Heavenly Father how do we do this? My own response was NO I will be OK until we get back to Australia but Lord we prayed for healing, and you are guiding me down the surgery path. I am in a foreign country. How do we do this.? Will you provide the right qualified surgeon to do this surgery? Our guide said he would be responsible for organising everything. Then there was an incredible God peace, all would be well. The staff at the emergency centre immobilised my arm and shoulder again. Thank you, God, for the emergency staff and x-ray machine in this small remote town. Now how will we reconnect with the team? Once outside, there was a car driven by one of the men from the café where everyone was lunching. So back to the café where our lunch waited us. Thank you, God for your provision and such beautiful people who provided their car when fuel is so expensive. After lunch, it was back on the bus and off to Kusadasi. How amazing! Our stop over is for three nights. Plenty of time. I will just rest. But no God was undertaking. There were other plans afoot.

On our arrival at the hotel, we were ushered into the hotel and the others were taken to be allocated their rooms while Robert and I were ushered aside with all of our luggage and placed into the hands of two paramedics. What was happening, where were we being taken? This was a little surreal. Were we just to trust them? The paramedics told us they were there to care for us. That our guide had been in contact, and it was all arranged to have me seen by professional doctors. **Thank You Heavenly Father.**

They ushered us to an awaiting ambulance to be taken to the Medilife centre via the local hospital for a shoulder scan. Here the head of emergency confirmed a fractured head of humerus and segmented shaft requiring immediate surgery. No one spoke English only the head of emergency.

We arrived at the Medilife centre and was greeted by Dr Amet who spoke very fluent English. **Paise God!! I am not in a place where I am unable to make myself understood anymore**. Dr Amet examined me, gave me pain relief, which I needed now after all the bumping around and a proper sling to support my arm. He explained the options to Robert and me and of what he had been able to organise for us.

- 1. A bed in an international hospital where English was spoken and would also include accommodation for Robert with me in my room.
- 2. An orthopaedic surgeon Doctor Aziz- one of the best
- 3. Surgery for the next day
- 4. Transport to the hospital for both of us
- 5. Transport back to the tour or a flight home whatever our choice was.

But the cost!! When told, my initial reaction was no way we could not afford that amount and was the surgery really necessary? Were we being taken advantage of? But I had seen the scan result at the hospital and knew it was. A quick prayer. Help Lord, is this, OK? The answer was peace!! Yes, you need the surgery. Doctor reminded me that we had very good travel insurance and that he would do all the paper work so that it would be approved when you get back to Australia. But you need to pay upfront!!! NOW but HOW? Australian banks put stops on your accounts if you move over \$10,00 dollars and the asking was multiples of \$10,000's. We didn't have phone link as we were unable to purchase a sim card which meant that we would have no bank connection if there should be an issue with the transfer. We needed to use the centres internet, but it was somewhat unstable, a problem all over Turkey. With prayer, Robert began the process and the way he chose proved to be successful. Thank you, God you guided and provided for us again.

All was organised so back in the ambulance for the trip to the hospital. I didn't ask how far. In my mind it would be just down the road like in Gosford. But OH NO! 100 kilometres later we arrived at the hospital. **Thank you for all your prayers. Praise God admission is quick**.

20 minutes later we were taken to a beautiful room eight stories up. It had normal hospital equipment for me and a king-sized single day bed for Robert to sleep on. I was ward admitted and settled for the night's sleep. **Relief I could sleep propped up. Praise God!!!**

Next morning Dr Aziz the surgeon visited, explained the procedure and that he would do his best to get us back on tour the next day if all went well and that was our choice. Lord, this is amazing. Thank you for such a lovely surgeon and that he can speak English so well. Thank you that surgery can happen so quickly. Thank you that we can meet up again with the tour without too much delay. Thank you for your provision and care you are an amazing God. Surgery was at 1pm Lord, fill this theatre with your Holy Spirit, protect my mind as I go under the anaesthetic, guide the hands of my surgeon and those who will assist, I am in your hands Lord Amen. I was back to my room by 4pm. Robert was very relieved to see me. During this time the Lord gave him the words to a beautiful poem that expressed his love for me and how he was feeling. Thank you, Lord, for your love and care of the beautiful love and relationship you have given us. We are both so blessed.

Next morning an x-ray first thing. Dr Aziz visited mid-morning, redid my dressing, explained what he found and did in surgery, that the x-ray showed the plate, nails and screws. were all correct and that I was free to return to the tour. **Praise God!!! Our God is a healer, and He was at work in my shoulder. I had faith and a prayer army at work in you all. Thank you again.** He, also said that he had never had anyone in our situation rejoin their tour, that they chose to go home. For me the thought of the long-haul flight straight on top of an anaesthetic was a no go. I needed time to get the strength to face it and my Heavenly Father would provide that strength when the time came, I just needed to rest in Him for a time and what better way than experiencing Paul's journey.

The big question for us now, was how do we get back to Kusadasi? Robert had attempted to have connection with the hospital internet to no avail. What's app our groups main connection didn't work. Phones didn't work, emails were out, how was this going to work. We just sat in our room, and no one came to talk with us. As I prayed God reminded me of Mary and Joseph. How that he led them in the middle of the night to flee to Egypt to keep Jesus safe. They knew no one, could not speak the language, had limited transport but that He was there all the way and provided for them so why was I concerned. Just rest, wait and watch. There was amazing peace. Then just before midday Argon one of the paramedics from the previous evening arrived in our room. The overwhelming feelings

of God's provision in not leaving us deserted was overpowering. He had come to take us back to the hotel but needed to go and discharge me. I asked if we were going back in the ambulance, and he laughed and said no a limousine. **How great is that. Nothing by half but the absolute best. Thank you, God you are doing it again.**

We rejoined the tour and although I didn't do all the walks, I was still able to appreciate the amazing magnitude of Paul's treks, the vastness of the ground he covered and the actual time, 40 years, that it took him. We covered part of it in 17 days.

The trip home although long, tiring and arduous especially for Robert who had to manage two lots of luggage and a wife that could do very little to help, continued to show us that God was ahead and providing for us. I did forget this at Abada be airport when we went close to missing our flight due to a miscommunication by airport staff not providing the assistance we were told had been organised for us. But once on board an upgrade to economy plus gave us two seats each and placed us near amenities large enough for Robert to be able to be with me to give assistance. **Thank you, Lord again and how blessed is that.**

Once home things seemed to be very slow with the care of my shoulder. Poor communications with medical staff meant that I was two weeks later in starting my physio-rehab and I was going to be three months before I could see a specialist here in Australia. The claim through the travel insurance was very slow with their communications and several papers had to be submitted a number of times. However, we are praising God and thankful for all your prayers and for all He has done.

The specialist praised the Turkish surgeon's work. He was able to see on the recent x-ray I had and said it was as he would have done. He was pleased with may range of movement already gained and estimated that I already had over 90% range restoration. What range I have by June next year would be my final gain. This was an amazing outcome as he felt I would just be able to do simple self-care and maybe able to drive again. Last week I was given the OK to drive again so I am mobile. I have also been blessed with a wonderful physiotherapist who is quite the expert with shoulders. There was a delay with obtaining a physiotherapist initially as the one the specialist was recommending was full. Her expertise has certainly ensured that I have been blessed with my care needs for total recovery. **Praise God!! I have a God of total healing to what I need, and I believe I will have the last 10% before June next year.**

Thank you again church family for your prayers and remember when we are asked to pray. Pray believing and He will give us an answer we just need to ask. And praise God the Travel insurance refund arrived in full in our bank account this week, so we have been blessed by our Heavenly Father in full. Praise God and bless you all for your faithfulness toward Robert and myself with your prayers. Amen
