From the Pastor:

I am pleased to introduce to you Francis Candiga, National Director of CEF South Sudan, who will be sharing with us in our 9.30am service on Sunday. South Sudan gained its independence from Sudan in 2011 after many years of war. But when independent South Sudan was just two years old as a nation, fighting broke out. A peace agreement was signed in 2015, but the result was only six months of peace before the agreement was violated, and all of South Sudan was thrust into civil war. Since then, an estimated four million refugees have fled their homes.

Francis writes, "There was an attack in our area, which forced almost everyone to leave. We tried to resist, persist, but soon, everyone had to flee. I left with my family, leaving all my belongings behind—everything. Everyone was in disarray."

Francis and his family crossed the border into Northern Uganda. For three months Francis worked to settle his family. Francis says they were not "wanderers," but that God had brought them there. "God opened massive opportunities for the children to hear the Gospel. We're so excited!"

Thank you, Francis, for coming to share with us on Sunday.

Ministry of Leftovers - by Caroline Murphy, for ABC Radio:

This ministry was inspired and motivated by God and the reading of his word; - John 6:12: Gather up the leftovers, let nothing be wasted."

One night, a growing concern about what to do with the Annual Church Fete leftover clothing and goods led me to reading the passage about Jesus feeding the multitude.

The words of John 6:12 spoke strongly to me and I felt like God was instructing me to make the most of the opportunity, to help the community. I wasn't sure how. It was a thought and idea that stayed with me and persisted for a few years, until 2019, when I prayed to God one morning while I was feeling low and I told God that I didn't want to waste my life, but that I wanted to serve him.

I committed my Mondays to God and started being available at church with the doors opened, but not really sure of what to do, or how to do it.

During the set-up process for the 2019 Fete, I was alone in the Upper Hall, and I heard God speak to my heart – "You can do this!" – an answer to my prayer of wanting to serve Him, but not knowing what to do.

I asked for permission to run a Jumble Sale after the Fete for a week, which went well and then I started running the Ministry of Leftovers every Monday 9am – 4pm and holding monthly market days in the Lower Hall, whilst also serving free coffee and tea. Each Monday was a time for people to come together doing craft, Bible study and have a 'cuppa'.

This grew to be bi-monthly market days and then to serving Thursdays also, after I was made redundant from work. I then went to setting up the upper hall as an established OP Shop and being opened Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. Now the MOL Op Shop and free drop in café, is currently opened Monday – Thursday 9am – 2pm (Closed on public holidays).

It's a full-time voluntary position that I love, that is challenging and difficult at times but seeing the good that is does for the Community, makes it worth it and I enjoy serving The Lord in this way.


